Description			

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

The first “Paths of European Heritage” International was held in San Venanzo (Italy) from the 26th to the 28th of September 2025.

The project included several preparatory activities for the implementation of a successful event and the achievement of all expected results.

Preparatory activities included the preparation and signature of internal agreements among the partners, describing rights and duties of the signing parts, the budget administration, internal deadlines and the specific documents to be returned by the partners as evidences of the correct implementation of the activities. Online coordination meetings among the project team members were organised to define a detailed work plan and effectively coordinate and plan the activities.

A logo and visual identity were created for the project by the Municipality of San Venanzo and agreed by all project partners, in order to make the project easily recognizable and identifiable.

All the four municipalities involved carried out communication and dissemination activities and meetings with their citizens to share the project and appropriately select the participants for this first International Event, according to the target group defined in the project application: young people and citizens, men and women, of different ages and occupations, who actively participate in the conservation of the cultural and natural heritage of their territory, as well as participants from the public, private and civil sectors, with a view to revitalizing the social fabric and promoting sustainable development. We would like to underline that participants have been selected to bring together representatives from the public, private and civil sector, including representatives of the respective Municipal Councils and involving people of different age groups, also ensuring gender balance.

The different activities carried out during the event involved a total of 76 participants from the 4 countries of different ages (5 < 18 y.o., 14 between 18 and 30 y.o., 29 between 30 and 50 y.o. and 28 over 50y.o.).

The international participants were 9 from San Lawrenz (MT), 8 from Tisno (HR) and 8 from Nagycenk (HU).

In addition to these, approximately 180 other people attended the international evening and dinner.

The Municipality of San Venanzo prepared a draft of the program of the event, that was discussed and agreed with all municipalities. Before the event, the hosting municipality sent the detailed program of activities and an info pack containing practical information for the participants.

Other preparatory activities for the event included the all arrangements related to: invitation of participants and policymakers, travel, accommodation and meals, reservation of rooms for public events, equipment, catering services, facilitators for round-table and workshops, photographer, translation in Italian and English languages, preparation of evaluation forms to be submitted during the activities to collect feedback from participants, signature lists, communication, monitoring and evaluation activities.

During the event, the following activities took place:

Thursday 25th September 2025

Arrival and accommodation at of participants; for the participants from Malta, pick up at the airport and transfer. Welcoming dinner.

Friday 26th September 2025

11:00 – 12:30: Welcome speech by the Mayor of San Venanzo in the Town Hall and tour of the San Venanzo nursery, primary, and secondary schools.

15:00 – 17:00: Visit to the Volcanological Museum and Park, discovering the three volcanoes of San Venanzo. The tour was led by two geologists, who, in addition to presenting one of the most attractive places in the area from a naturalistic, cultural, and touristic perspective, emphasized the importance of protecting and enhancing our natural resources, with a view to sustainable development.

17:00 – 19:30: Round-tables and workshops: The representative of the Municipality of San Venanzo introduced the project to participants, the aim and objectives, going over the programme of activities, and informed of the upcoming international event in San Lawrenz (MT). Representatives of the Municipalities of Tisno, Nagycenk and San Lawrenz presented their towns and introduced their participants to the event.

Participants were then divided into 3 groups for round-tables and discussion according to their interest and experience of the following topics:

- Environmental protection and enhancement, sustainable development;

- Social inclusion, equal opportunities and intercultural dialogue;
- Active participation, volunteering and EU citizenship.

The participants had the opportunity to share their personal or local experiences, to share examples and good practices from each country/community and to discuss for the promotion of good habits, for the improvement of local/EU issues and for sharing ideas for further cooperation activities and events.

Each group was asked to create an output to be presented the following day during the public conference.

The first group created a cardboard with post-it notes sharing their “good sustainable habits” and “bad habits” to improve. The group discussion also focused on the use of renewable energy sources and the related issues concerning to the land use and environmental impact, but participants also shared activities, events and projects carried out in each country to promote and protect natural resources, such as eco-walks.

The second group discussion focused on the common values that unite European citizens, such as peace, tolerance, understanding and respect, on concrete actions to promote gender equality and social inclusion, and on the importance of dialogue and exchange with people from a different culture. Participants were also invited to imagine an intercultural event/activity to organize in their municipality or school to promote social inclusion or dialogue between European cultures. As a result, they created a draft of a new project to be submitted for the continuation of the collaboration among our four municipalities, with the objectives of: promoting common EU Values, strengthening social inclusion, promoting gender equality, fighting against prejudices and highlighting the importance of twinnings.

The third group discussion focused on the meaning of “active participation”, on the participation to volunteering activities in each town and the importance of volunteering, also helping to create a stronger sense of European identity and solidarity. As a result, the group was invited to write on a cardboard titled “Is even a small gesture active participation?”, a gesture of active participation that can contribute to the collective well-being and/or a motivational phrase to raise awareness and promote active participation and volunteering among their peers.

Saturday 27th September 2025

10:00 – 12:30: PUBLIC CONFERENCE “PATHS OF EUROPEAN HERITAGE... TOWARDS TOWN-TWINNING”

Dissemination of the PEH project and opportunities offered by the European Union and the CERV programme to the local population, with the involvement of representatives of Regione Umbria, ANCI (Associazione Nazionale dei Comuni Italiani) and the Regional Federation of AICCRE (Associazione Italiana per il Consiglio dei Comuni e delle Regioni d'Europa).

They illustrated the opportunities offered by the CERV program and some regional twinning experiences. The discussion allowed for the sharing of experiences and the encouragement of new collaborations between local administrations and communities. It was underlined how crucial these opportunities are for knowledge between peoples of different cultures, for the promotion of peace and inclusion.

During the conference, the participants also presented the outputs of the round-tables and workshops held in the previous day, for sharing good practices from the four Municipalities.

At the end of the conference a questionnaire was shared with all participants (in English and in Italian language), in order to collect feedback about the implementation of the event and the project.

Conclusion of the conference with the participation of the San Venanzo musical band, which played the national anthems of Italy, Malta, Croatia and Hungary and the European Union anthem. Final Aperitif.

17:30 – 18:30: Discussion and preparation of formal twinning agreements with the Municipalities of Tisno and San Lawrenz and planning for the continuation of cooperation relations between the four Municipalities involved.

19:00 – 23:00: INTERCULTURAL NIGHT

An intercultural evening to foster understanding and dialogue among the citizens of our municipalities, sharing our history, cultures, values, and identities, celebrating differences and similarities.

Food, music and dances from the four countries, with the participation of the Musical Band of San Venanzo and four members of the traditional dancing group Czenki Hársfa Néptáncgyesület from Nagycenk (HU). The dinner was organised in collaboration with two local associations of San Venanzo: Pro Loco San Venanzo and Associazione Tartufai del Monte Peglia.

During dinner, each foreign municipality set up its own table with food and drinks from its own country, also offering flyers and brochures to promote its own territory and cultural heritage.

More than 200 citizens of San Venanzo attended the event, and some of them contributed by bringing cakes to share.

After dinner, the four Hungarian participants, members of the traditional dance group, performed in their traditional costumes, engaging the audience at the end. This was followed by a musical performance by the San Venanzo Music Band, which also included two Hungarian participants.

Sunday 28th September 2025

Cultural tour to discover the rich natural and cultural heritage of San Venanzo and its villages. Visit of the medieval hamlets of San Vito Castello, Rotecastello, Ripalvella and Collelungo. Convivial moment and lunch in San Marino, located in the Elmo-Melonta nature reserve, along the "Le Vie del Peglia" trail. The visits were organised by local citizens or members of the cultural associations from each village: San Vito Insieme, La Cantinetta Eventi APS, Comitato festeggiamenti combattenti e reduci di Ripalvella, AS Gioco Sport San Marino 85.

Departure of participants from Tisno (HR) and Nagycenk (HU).

Cultural visit to Orvieto.

Monday 29th September 2025

Free day.

Tuesday 30th September 2025

Transfer to the airport and departure of participants from San Lawrenz (MT).

EVALUATION OF THE EVENT:

At the end of the conference and after the event, an online questionnaire was shared with all participants using Google forms (in English and in Italian language), in order to collect feedback about the implementation of the event and the project. The following aspects have been evaluated by 34 participants which filled in the questionnaire: overall evaluation of the event (average rate 4.65 out of 5); usefulness of the meeting (average rate 4.56 out of 5); participants communication and interaction (average rate 4.59 out of 5); possibility of free expression of opinion during the event (average rate 4.76 out of 5); accessibility of the venues of the events (average rate 4.65 out of 5); degree of language barriers (average rate 2.61 out of 5); quality of the overall organisation (accommodation - average rate 4.52 out of 5, meals and subsistence - average rate 4.23 out of 5, practical arrangements - average rate 4.28 out of 5, information received - average rate 4.38 out of 5, inclusion activities and contact opportunities with local population - average rate 4.38 out of 5); % of participants interested in participating in other similar projects and/or activities (98%); % of participants in the activities interested in the CERV Programme (93%).

CONCLUSIONS:

This International event between the four European municipalities provided a unique opportunity to promote intercultural dialogue, the sharing of common values and active engagement in the preservation of cultural heritage.

Throughout the event, we witnessed exceptional participation from citizens of all ages. The interactions between different communities helped strengthen a sense of shared belonging and sparked deep reflection on the importance of maintaining strong ties with our history and culture.

The event highlighted how twinning can be a powerful tool for breaking down cultural and social barriers. The shared activities, including workshops, cultural visits, and round-table discussions, facilitated a greater understanding among citizens of the different municipalities, allowing them to discover the traditions, customs, and values of other cultures while also recognizing similarities and points of connection. In particular, the active participation of young people was key to fostering a culture of inclusivity and shared responsibility, paving the way for a more aware and engaged European citizenship in the future.

A central theme that emerged during the event was the preservation and enhancement of cultural and natural heritage, seen as a collective responsibility. The international participants had the opportunity to learn about the heritage of San Venanzo, with its peculiarities, as well as the problems related to its management and valorization.

Another key outcome of this international event was the increased awareness of the opportunities offered by the European Union in terms of international cooperation and development. Citizens are now more informed about European programs and the possibilities for actively participating in building a more united and inclusive Europe. This event demonstrated that twinning is not only an opportunity

to deepen cultural ties but also a platform for giving voice to local needs and promoting active European citizenship.

The activities and reflections that emerged during the event have laid a solid foundation for future collaborations between the participating municipalities.

As a testimony to the importance of this international event for the local population, we would like to underline that the event has seen the participation and collaboration of almost all the associations of the Municipality of San Venanzo, that contributed to the planning, implementation, visibility and dissemination of the project and event: Pro Loco San Venanzo, UNITRE San Venanzo, La Cantinetta Eventi APS, ASD San Venanzo, Associazione Tartufai del Monte Peglia, AS Gioco Sport San Marino 85, Associazione Amici del Monte Peglia, San Vito Insieme, Associazione Amici di Poggio Aquilone, Comitato festeggiamenti combattenti e reduci di Ripalvella, L'Appomessa, Misericordia di San Venanzo, Associazione Gaia APS, Travelogue APS.

In conclusion, the event was remarkably successful, achieving all its objectives, strengthening relationships between long-standing and new partner communities, raising awareness of European values, and laying the foundation for continued collaboration in the remaining project activities. It represented a significant opportunity for growth and international outreach for the community of the Municipality of San Venanzo and from the other 3 European Municipalities involved, and it reinforced the awareness that a more united and supportive Europe is possible, starting from the concrete actions of all citizens who, day by day, contribute to the creation of a more inclusive, equitable, and culturally rich society.

COMMUNICATION AND DISSEMINATION ACTIVITIES:

A significant effort was dedicated to communication and dissemination activities, which were strategically structured and implemented from the months preceding the international event.

After the design of a project logo and visual identity, these activities were organised in three phases: project promotion, citizen awareness raising, and international event planning; project and event promotion and visibility; and dissemination of the outcomes and experiences from the international event.

Considering the wide and diverse target audience, multiple communication channels were used, both online and offline: official Municipal website, Facebook pages, Instagram profiles, local WhatsApp groups/channels, local newspapers, leaflets and posters, word of mouth, local meetings with stakeholders.

The contribution of local associations and organizations in San Venanzo was also significant, supporting the promotion of the project and international event in their networks and through their social media channels, thus further multiplying the outreach and impact of "Paths of European Heritage".

In all communication and dissemination activities we acknowledged the co-funding of the European Union, also giving visibility to the CERV programme, according to the EU visibility guidelines.

A communication and dissemination report was collected, with a comprehensive archive of all produced materials (including links and publication dates), that will be kept as a record by the Municipality of San Venanzo.
